
Drones Get Out!





Robbing:

- Don't break honeycomb
- Don't spill Syrup
- Keep tools clean
- Reduce Entrances
- Remove Screened Bottom Boards
- Seal any cracks.
- What you see...fighting at entrance, dead worker bees.
- Starving bees (heads stuck in cells, cold, lifeless, clustered in small ball)
- Wax cappings littering bottom board
- Try draping wet sheet, drape to ground, rewet, remove in 24-48 hours....however when it starts very difficult to stop.
- USE ROBBING SCREENS

Reduce Space

Store Drawn Comb to prevent damage

Do not kill a hive, opportunists



Decrease Inspections





Demographics for Spring

Stimulate 6 weeks prior to Spring Flowers

Increase or resume Protein Patty internal supplement

Free Feeding Protein Powder - or will forage coffee grounds, sawdust, bird/chicken/animal feed dusts, etc. Not just your bees.

Garden plants (pollen): Gazania, Lobelia, Calendula, Snapdragons, blanket flower, brassicas, etc.

Sugar Syrup

1:1 Pure Cane White Sugar to water by weight

OR

1 water to 2 Sugar if not enough honey stores

Candy/Fondant/Sugar Board

NO CORN SYRUP

 Syrup feeders: Frame, entrance, top or free feed if over 100 yards away.



Winter

Some hives will not shut down – Mites Laying Workers – Don't borrow resources to fix failing hives Queens? – Possible source year round

Good time to clean, sort, and order/build equipment for Spring. Place orders for nucs. Beginners read, youtube, take hands-on classes – LOCATION, LOCATION, LOCATION
