Preparing for Winter

With the days still topping 100 degrees and the hot sun unrelenting, it seems odd to talk about winter. Although our Tucson winter is so mild that it attracts hordes of migratory snowbirds, it is still an issue for us beekeepers.

Winter is similar whether one keeps bees in the snowy Midwest, coastal California, or Tucson. It is a time of dearth with few sources of nectar and pollen for the bees. Days are shorter, causing the queen to slow egg-laying, and the bees to produce few or no drones. Lower temperatures and increased precipitation can stress a colony.

Monica King will discuss what winter means for our bees here in Baja Arizona and offer suggestions on what beekeepers can do to help their bees get through the next few months and go into spring strong and healthy.


